<b>Description:</b>	<p>If you are interested in teaching within a learn to swim environment utilising the ASA National Plan for Teaching Swimming, this certificate is suitable for you. Achievement of this certificate will qualify you to operate as a teacher. It will provide you with the generic “how to teach/coach” skills common to all disciplines together with a specific focus on Teaching Aquatics, covering a range of technical knowledge and practical skills that will allow you to plan, deliver and evaluate a series of consecutive sessions within the context of a self prepared scheme of work.</p>
<b>Assessment:</b>	<p>Assessment is by the course tutor/assessor and will cover:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Practical coaching through the use of an observation and oral checklist</li> <li>• Theoretical knowledge through the use of a written knowledge test</li> <li>• Planning, preparation and other associated tasks through the completion of the appropriate Level 2 log book</li> <li>• Assessment of Unit 6 will cover practical coaching through the use of an observation, oral and/or written and recorded against a checklist of competence related to specific outcomes. This may also be supported by expert witness testimony</li> <li>• Courses leading to an ASA qualification are subject to an internal and external verification process</li> </ul>

<b>Further study:</b>	<p>This qualification may enable you to secure paid or voluntary work as a Teacher of Aquatics utilising the ASA National Plan for Teaching Swimming (NPTS) or equivalent scheme. The qualification is the second stage in a 3 level teaching structure. The next stage is the ASA Level 3 Certificate for Teaching Aquatics. Units 1 - 3 (Health &amp; Safety, Principles of Teaching/Coaching and Sport Science) are transferable across all ASA disciplines so if you wish to take an ASA Level 2 Certificate for Coaching qualification in another discipline you are only required to hold the Unit 2 of the relevant Level 1 Certificate for Coaching or have gained exemption and then complete Units 4 - 6 within that discipline.</p>
