

Swim England National Development Programme

This is the third step on the Swim England Extended Talent Pathway, but the first of the national framework. Swimmers are selected to participate in the Swim England National Development Programme.

2020 Programme aims

- Via an online platform, dry land conditioning will emphasise mobility and stability to enhance the anti-rotational / rotational strokes and streamlining.
- Online workshops will be delivered for 'Loving Race Day', sleep recovery and Injury prevention.
- You will need to have watched, read and understood the Swim England inclusion and culture policy.
- To enhance the understanding of the person, athlete and performer within the OADF principles.

Duration and location

Online learning engagement day.

Dates

3/4 October 2020

Key selection criteria

- Up to 72 swimmers (36 male and 36 female) will be selected per online camp.
- Short course and long course times achieved and recorded on the Swim England database between 22 March 2019 and 15 March 2020 will be considered.
- The highest long course and the highest short course ranked 13 year old and 14 year old male and female swimmers (age as of 31 December 2020), in each Olympic event will be selected.
- Further selections will be made from second, third etc. ranked swimmers until maximum numbers per camp are achieved. Where swimmers have an equal ranking, selections will be prioritised based upon the highest FINA Point Score.
- Duplicate rankings will be discarded.

- Swimmers will be allocated to an appropriate online camp.
- Further selections may be made at the absolute discretion of Swim England National Talent Officers, in agreement with the Swim England Head of Talent – Swimming.
- Swimmers attendance is compulsory.
