- · Swim England Assistant Swimming Coach
- · Swim England Swimming Coach Certificate
- · ASA Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Swimming
- · 1st 4sport Level 2 Certificate in Coaching Triathlon
- · RLSS Pool to Pond Award.

1.5 Progression

On completion of this qualification, you could work as a coach in an appropriate environment to develop your experience and knowledge within open water swimming.

02 Assessment

2.1 Assessment methods

You will be required to demonstrate the knowledge and understanding you have learnt through this qualification.

Evidence may be generated through a variety of assessment methods, including, but not limited to: questioning, professional discussion, assignments or practical observation.

2.2 Grading

There is no grading criteria for this qualification. You will be awarded either a pass or refer.

2.3 Registration
