****Prioritisation of Team Entries and Confirmation of entries****

In line with the Event Conditions 5.9 to 5.13, clubs may submit up to four (4) Combinations into Combo Cup in total but teams are to be entered in priority order.

In summary:

- Swim England Clubs will be guaranteed a minimum of one (1) Combination and may enter a maximum of four (4) Combinations.
- Clubs with more than one combination entry, must enter their Combination entries in priority order, **with 1 being the top priority Combination entry.**
- The maximum capacity number of entries is capped at 100 Combinations. If Combination entries exceed the maximum number of 100 Combinations, the following procedure will be applied:
 - Clubs with the largest number of routines will be asked to reduce first. e.g.: All clubs with 4 Combination entries will be asked to reduce to 3.
 - All affected clubs will be contacted directly, and **all accepted Combination entries will be confirmed by Thursday 11 June.**
- Swim England clubs will take priority. Scottish Swimming and Swim Wales clubs may submit their entries in the same timelines and will be advised if there is capacity by Thursday 11 June

Points to note:

Clubs should enter their teams on the online entry system in the priority order, with the first priority team being entered first (with team's swimmers selected).

- Before payment, clubs will be able to review their teams within the entry system, which will display club's teams in the order they were added to the system, whereby the highest listed team represents the top priority team and so on.
- Before payment, clubs may edit their teams, their order and swimmers as necessary.

The entry is not complete until payment is processed and a confirmation email has been received from PayPal. Payment is via debit/credit card ONLY; please follow the PayPal payment instructions. Clubs are reminded that electronic entrants are bound by the conditions of entry without signature.

Uploading an accreditation photo

All competitors are required to upload a photo of themselves for accreditation purposes before an entry can be submitted. If the photo is deemed to be unsuitable (either on the grounds of poor quality or wrong identity) entry into the event may not be permitted.

Grade Level

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The required Grade Levels are detailed in the Event Conditions (see *Conditions*, p.14).

A competitor's Routine and Figure Grade Level can be viewed online via the Membership Check (see *Membership* section above).

Club Officials

All participating clubs are required to provide at least one suitably qualified Judge/ Synchronisation Technical Controller (STC) as part of club entry into the event.

Expenses for these officials must be the responsibility of the clubs. Lunch and refreshments will be covered by the event and will be provided to all working officials on the day.

Judges/STCs must be National Judges and if the club does not have a Judge available, please ask other clubs to 'borrow' one.

Judges can be Level 1 for Division 1 but must be Level 2 for Division 2. Any clubs entering Division 2 will need to provide a judge with the minimum Level 2 Judge qualification.

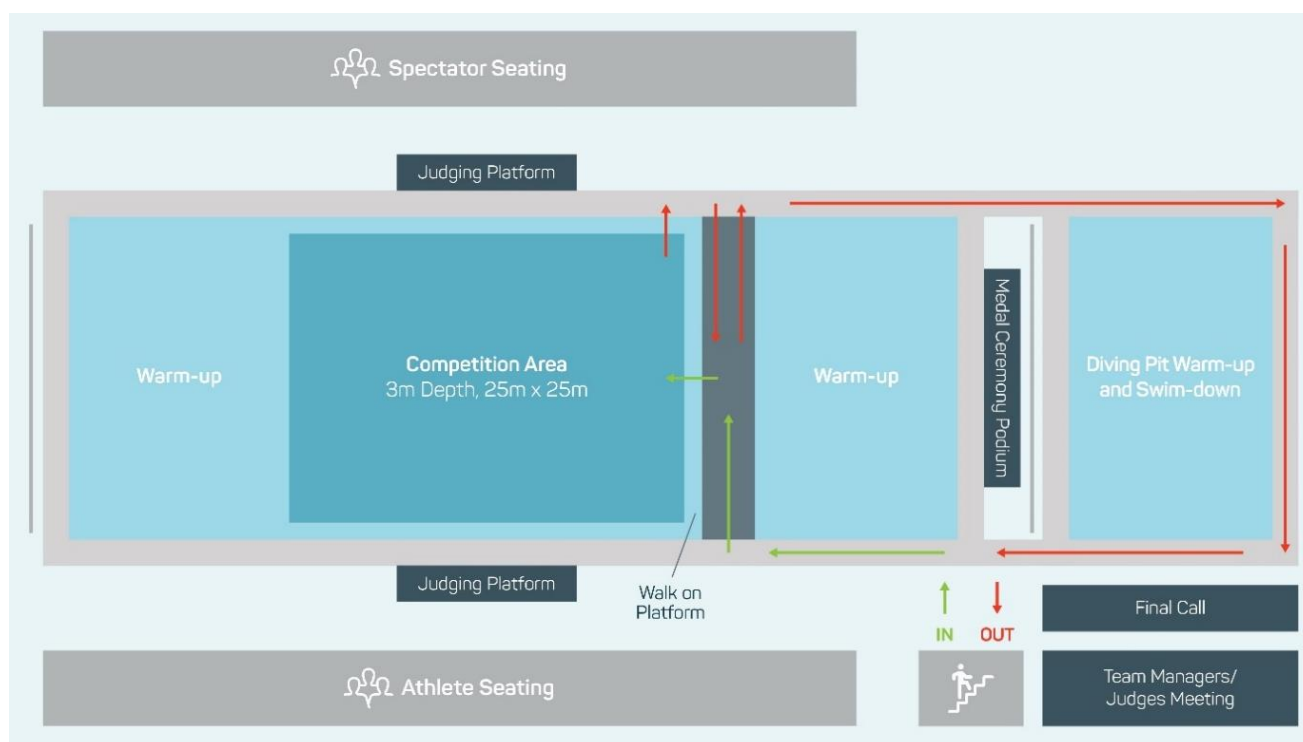
One representative from every club due to participate at the event (this can be a coach or team manager) is encouraged to attend an online pre-event briefing to hear all the key event information.

Pool and Platform Information



The 50m pool will be split with a boom, which will serve as the walk on platform at 3m pool depth.

Warm up Pods: 2m throughout

Competition Area: 3m throughout

Diving Pit: 5.8m throughout

Medal ceremonies will take place at the diving pit end of the pool.

Changing Rooms

Changing rooms are located on the ground floor level of the venue and will not be allocated. Further information on the management of the changing rooms will be communicated within the event Confirmation Pack.

Team preparation Area and Athlete Seating

Team preparation areas will be made available behind the Athlete Seating tribunes.

Directional signage will be in place to direct teams to Athlete Seating and Team Preparation Areas, which will be on the 1st Floor of the venue, through the pool hall doors.

Teams will be allocated a specific Team preparation area. There will be no mirrors made available by the event nor access to boiling water. Teams are asked to be self-sufficient and come prepared.

Training, Warm Up and Swim Down

Training in the competition pool will be made available prior to the competition with no music. A full warm up schedule will be available once all entries have been confirmed and published in the event Confirmation Pack.

By entering this event the athlete consents to report to Doping Control, if requested, at any time during this event and agrees to abide by the Aquatics GB Anti-Doping Rules (2021), which Swim England is signed up to.

If an athlete is tested through doping control at an event, they should ensure they provide detail of all medications (prescribed or over the counter and including dosage) and supplements taken within the last 7 days in advance of the test on the Doping Control Form. Any previously disclosed medications or supplements to the athlete's club and/or talent programme are still required to be included on the doping control form.

Medications

- Medication should be checked via Global DRO (see above).
- If the medication being taken is prohibited in or out of competition, a Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) may be required.

Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE)

- If an athlete IS WITHIN the National TUE Pool they are required to obtain a TUE before using a prohibited medication or method. Athletes can check if they are within the National TUE Pool via UKAD website (see above) and by selecting 'aquatics'.
- If an athlete is NOT within the National TUE Pool but using a prohibited medication or method and is subject to doping control they are required to apply for a retroactive TUE as soon as possible after doping control. A retroactive TUE must be submitted to UKAD (UK Anti-Doping) within five (5) working days of the testing taking place.

All athletes are subject to 'Strict Liability' which means an athlete is wholly responsible for any banned substance found in their system, no matter how it got there.



ACCREDITATION

Accreditation must be worn at all times inside the venue within accredited areas. Accreditation will be issued on an individual and event basis, and is non-transferrable.

Competitors

Competitor accreditation will be sent in a confirmation email on completion of the entry and will be sent to the email address provided at the time of entry.

The following guidelines should be followed to ensure the competitor accreditation is correct:

- Competitor accreditation must be printed in advance and brought to the event.
- Once printed, the accreditation should be folded twice so that the photo is visible on the front and back.
- At the event, lanyards and accreditations pouches will be available from collection points for accreditation passes.

A £10 charge will be applied to replace any lost or forgotten accreditations.

Accreditation checks will be carried out at the event and entry into the event may be denied without the accreditation pass.

Coaches, team managers and chaperones requiring access to poolside must purchase a Poolside Accreditation pass in advance of the event and must fulfil the following criteria, as required by their role, when applying for a pass to attend any Swim England National events:

- 1. Enhanced DBS:** valid Disclosure with Barred Service Check (NB: applications can take up to 60 days and is outside of Swim England's control). If you have any queries contact dbs@swimming.org.
- 2. Minimum Qualification/Requirements (specific to the role):**
 - a. Coaches – Coaching Qualification or Assistant Coach Certificate
 - b. Team Manager – Team Manager Training Module 1 or 2 Certificate
 - c. Chaperone – Club authorisation to be acting in loco parentis on behalf of the Club
- 3. Safeguarding Certificate: valid Safeguarding certificate updated and recorded with Swim England Membership Department.**

Lost or Forgotten Accreditation Passes

EVENT CONDITIONS

1. General Conditions

- 1.1. The Artistic Swimming Leadership Group (“the Group”) reserves full powers over the Swim England Artistic Swimming Combo Cup (“the Combo Cup”), including but not limited to cancelling, postponing or changing the Combo Cup venue and/or format due to reasons beyond its reasonable control.
- 1.2. The Combo Cup shall be competed for under World Aquatics Technical Rules of Artistic Swimming (701 et seq) and as provided by the following conditions. Where World Aquatics Rules do not provide (for example: Health and Safety Regulations and guidelines and Child Safeguarding), the requirements of the Swim England Regulations shall apply.
- 1.3. Entries will be accepted from competitors registered as members of Swim England, Scottish Swimming and Swim Wales.
- 1.4. The promotion of the Combo Cup shall be the responsibility of the Group, which shall for all purposes be regarded as the Promoter. It shall decide any matter arising that is not covered by these conditions, subject to conformity with Swim England Regulations.
- 1.5. A competitor must have been a registered member, or equivalent, of the club in whose name they are entered, at least 60 days prior to the first day of the competition.
- 1.6. By entering this event, competitors consent to report to Doping Control if requested at any time during this event. Competitors also agree to abide by the Aquatics GB & UKAD Anti-Doping Rules. (For further information, see [Link.](#))
- 1.7. All Clubs must have at least qualified Level 1 Artistic Swimming Coach on the poolside. The Coach must be in possession of an official event poolside accreditation Pass.

2. Officials

- 2.1. All officials shall be qualified and be on the Swim England Artistic Swimming Licensed Officials List (where applicable).
- 2.2. All clubs must provide at least one suitably qualified Official (Judge or Synchronisation Technical Controller (STC)).
 - 2.2.1. For entries in Division 1, a minimum Level 1 judge or STC must be provided.
 - 2.2.2. For entries in Division 2, a minimum Level 2 judge or STC must be provided
 - 2.2.3. STC can be a level 3 Judge who has completed the STC Training or a DTC.
- 2.3. Additional Officials will be appointed from the Swim England Artistic Swimming Licensed Officials List (where applicable).
- 2.4. The Referee and Chief Recorder shall be approved by the Group.

3. Method of Entry

- 3.1. Entries must be submitted online and will be accepted at the discretion of the organisers to ensure the event is not oversubscribed.
- 3.2. Entries shall be submitted together with the appropriate entry fees, no later than the set closing deadline. An updated photograph of each competitor must be also submitted online.
- 3.3. If required, all music information must be registered with The Limited Manufacturing License, Mechanical-Copyright Protection Society (MCPS).
- 3.4. All music must be submitted for each routine electronically no later than the entry deadline. Routines without submitted music by the published deadline may not be permitted to swim in the Combo Cup.
- 3.5. A Coach Card must be submitted for each routine electronically prior to the competition (see Appendix 2). Routines without a submitted Coach Card by the published deadline may not be permitted to swim in the Combo Cup.

4. The Combo Cup Events

- 4.1. The competition events shall be divided into two Divisions.
- 4.2. Both Divisions will have the following Age Groups:
 - 4.2.1. 12 & Under Years
 - 4.2.2. 13 – 15 Years
 - 4.2.3. 15 – 19 Years
 - 4.2.4. 15 & Under Years
 - 4.2.5. 13 – 19 Years

5. Entry Qualifications

- 5.1. The following Table shows the Figure and/or Routine Grades required for qualification entries for each Division and Age Group:

Age Group	Division 1	Division 2
12 & Under	Figure or Routine Grade 0 – 2	Figure or Routine Grade 2 – 3
13 – 15 Years	Figure or Routine Grade 0 – 3	Figure or Routine Grade 3+
15 – 19 Years	Figure or Routine Grade 0 – 3	Figure or Routine Grade 3+
15 & Under	Figure or Routine Grade 0 – 3	Figure or Routine Grade 3+
13 – 19 Years	Figure or Routine Grade 0 – 3	Figure or Routine Grade 3+

- 5.2. Age as at midnight on the 31 December in the year of competition.
- 5.3. Competitors must be Club Compete registered members of Swim England, except for competitors who enter Division 1 and hold Grade 2 or less. These competitors may hold Swim England Club Train membership or equivalent for competitors from Scottish Swimming or Swim Wales.
- 5.4. Competitors may only enter one Combination event.
- 5.5. Competitors of any gender are eligible to compete.
- 5.6. Competitors must have achieved the relevant Figure and/or Routine Grade level by 27 May 2026 and be valid on the day of the competition.
- 5.7. Clubs must enter the correct age group for their swimmers. The 15&U Age Group must contain a swimmer under the age of 13) If a club is unable to register the swimmers in the correct age group on the day of competition, the team shall be disqualified.
- 5.8. Any swimmer who is part of the Senior, Junior or Youth National Squads 2026 by the closing date of entries is not eligible to compete. Any athletes within the Development and/or training squads who are moved into the National squads after April 2026 may be eligible depending on training and international competition schedule and at the discretion of the National Coaching Team in collaboration with the Club.
- 5.9. Clubs may enter one or more Combination in each age group.
- 5.10. Swim England Clubs will be guaranteed a minimum of one (1) Combination and may enter a maximum of four (4) Combinations in total.
- 5.11. Clubs with more than one combination entry must enter their Combination entries in priority order, with 1 being the top priority Combination entry.
- 5.12. The maximum capacity number of entries is capped at 100 Combinations.
- 5.13. If Combination entries exceed the maximum number of 100 Combinations, the following procedure will be applied:
 - 5.13.1. Clubs with the largest number of routines will be asked to reduce first. e.g.: All clubs with 4 Combination entries will be asked to reduce to 3.
 - 5.13.2. All affected clubs will be contacted directly and all accepted Combination entries will be confirmed by Thursday 11 June.
 - 5.13.3. Swim England clubs will take priority. Scottish Scotland and Swim Wales

clubs may submit their entries in the same timelines and will be advised if there is capacity by Thursday 11 June.

6. Competition Conditions

- 6.1. The order of appearance will be by random draw.
- 6.2. A Free Combination shall consist of not less than eight (8) nor more than ten (10) competitors. A maximum of two (2) reserves is allowed.
- 6.3. The names of the competitors competing must be submitted to the Referee, in writing, within one (1) hour of the start of the event competition. Changes after this time may only be made in the case of sudden illness or accident of the competitor, and if the reserve is ready to compete without delaying the event. If, due to illness or accident at the competition, a lack of a reserve reduces the team size to less than eight (8) the team will incur a 0.5 penalty
- 6.4. Failure to notify the Referee of substitution and/ or withdrawals shall result in disqualification.
- 6.5. The number of hybrids and acrobatics shall be performed in accordance with Appendix 1.
- 6.6. Time limits for the routines (for both Divisions) will be according as follows:

7. Calculation of the Routine results

- 7.1. The judging scoring for this year's Combo Cup will be based on World Aquatics Rules 2026, with the following exceptions:
 - 7.1.1. No DD will be declared
 - 7.1.2. Basemarks will be pre-set as follows: 1.0 for Acros and 1.5 for Hybrid
 - 7.1.3. No Bonus will be declared
 - 7.1.4. The team with the lowest synchronisation error score in each event will receive a bonus of 5 points added to the Elements score
- 7.2. Medals will be awarded to competitors who are placed first, second and third in each age group and in each Division. Reserves are eligible for medals. Only competitors who swim be allowed on the Medal Podium, with the exception of the Combo Cup Trophy where all swimmers are eligible to collect the Trophy.
- 7.3. Points will be awarded according to the ranked place of the Team as follows:

1 point will be awarded to Combos with 10 competitors who swim.	

- 7.3.1. In the event of a tie, the routine with the highest Elements score will determine the number of points. If there is still a tie, the highest choreography and musicality score in Artistic Impression will decide. All scores used to calculate in the event of a tie will be prior to any penalties used.

- 7.3.2. Clubs with more than one team in the same age group in the same Division will be eligible for points.
- 7.3.3. The Combo Cup will be awarded to the club with the highest points total from all events across both Divisions.
- 7.3.4. In the event of a tie in the total number of Trophy points, the Combo Cup will be awarded to the Club with the highest average routine score.

8. Event Cancellation and Abandonment

- 8.1. In the instance that the event is cancelled or abandoned:
 - 8.1.1. Full refunds of entry fees to the event will be offered to all competitors.
 - 8.1.2. No refunds will be offered for any other expenses incurred in relation to the event.
